## RE: Urgent Request for Clarification on H.R. 1319 (American Rescue Plan Act of 2021)

Secretary Yellen,

On behalf of the organizations listed below, we are asking for your immediate clarification on language included in H.R. 1319 that we believe could prevent California from investing in critical anti-poverty and business recovery programs.

As signed into law, H.R. 1319 includes the following restriction on the use of the funds allocated by the bill: "A State or territory shall not use the funds provided under this section or transferred pursuant to section 603(c)(4) to either directly or indirectly offset a reduction in the net tax revenue of such State or territory resulting from a change in law, regulation, or administrative interpretation during the covered period that reduces any tax (by providing for a reduction in a rate, a rebate, a deduction, a credit, or otherwise) or delays the imposition of any tax or tax increase<sup>1</sup>."

While we understand the intent of this language, it is overly broad and is now limiting and could prevent well-intentioned and critical aid legislation from moving forward in the California Legislature. Inclusion of the word "indirectly" has created much confusion for policymakers and the business community, who are working together in a bipartisan manner to support tax credits, fee waivers and other assistance programs to small businesses, restaurants, non-profits and other industries disproportionately affected by the COVID-19 pandemic.

Additionally, California continues to invest critical dollars into the state's most successful anti-poverty program, the Earned Income Tax Credit (EITC). However, we have serious concerns that H.R. 1319 could prevent an expansion of the EITC at a time when additional tax credits to working families is most critical. Working families have been disproportionately hurt by this pandemic and deserve certainty that an expanded EITC is possible now and in the future.
